SUBJECT: Revision of Department of Defense (DoD) Order of Precedence


This memorandum forwards a proposed update to the DoD Order of precedence list published on November 15, 2002. This revision reflects organizational changes that have occurred since publication, as well as all recommended and approved changes submitted since then. Each proposed revision to the list is italicized and followed by an explanatory note.

The attached list provides the relative protocol precedence for members within DoD and is used to determine the order of precedence for the following:

- (1) official visit activities.
- (2) assignment of government quarters.
- (3) travel status on government aircraft and surface transportation (when mission essential) to include scheduling and seating.
- (4) seating arrangements and similar requirements at official functions and other activities requiring precedence decisions.

Request your concurrence and/or comments by April 28, 2003. If changes are recommended, they must include detailed supporting justification. NOTES:

1. Within a group listed on a line under a code, precedence for Senate confirmed positions is established by date of appointment. For the Combatant Commanders, order is by date of appointment; for Commanders who previously held a confirmed position (i.e. CJCS, VCJCS, Service Chief, or previous Combatant Command), use the initial date of appointment to that position.
2. For non-statutory positions within a group, precedence is by date assigned to the position.
3. Precedence for Defense Agency Directors is determined by the establishment date of the organization.
4. Code 4 precedence applies to the currently serving Service Senior Enlisted Advisors. Certain protocol functions may require a deviation from the established precedence. Retired service senior enlisted advisors should be placed in front of other retired members of the same grade (E-9).
5. SES precedence is established by the position held, not pay grade. While SES pay code (ES 1-6) does not affect precedence, in general, those SES members in positions not specifically identified above who are in ES-5 and ES-6 should be in Code 5 and ES-1 through ES-4 should be in Code 6; if there is a question, contact the member's office or the service office responsible for SES matters. *While precedence of SES for DoD functions and activities will be in accordance with the established DoD Precedence Listing, each of the Services may adjust the priority code for members of the SES for Service-related functions and activities as appropriate. (added for clarity and flexibility).*
6. *For Service-related functions and activities, when appropriate to do so, the Services may adjust the established order of precedence as necessary.*
