MEMORANDUM FOR All Camp San Luis Obispo (CSLO) Employees and Tenants

SUBJECT: Animal Policy for Camp San Luis Obispo (CSLO Policy #07-04)

1. Reference California Code of Regulations, (Title XIV, Div 3, Chapter 1) 4312 Control of Animals; Title 9 of the San Luis Obispo County Codes; and Section 31101, Seizure and Impounding Dogs: of the U. S. Government Code.
2. Pets, to include dogs and cats, can not be turned loose on the installation. All animals must be under immediate physical control. It is unlawful for any person to have an animal in an open or public area unless the animal is securely leashed and the leash is held continuously in the hand of a responsible person capable of controlling the animal. Animals must be on a tended leash no more than 6 feet in length.
3. Owners will act responsibly by abiding by the following:
 - Owners will not endanger or harm any animal.
 - No animal is to be endangered by being restrained on a leash and then abandoned (in a vehicle, tied outside a building, etc) for any length of time.
 - No animal may be turned loose (dog, cat or any animal) in any area, or common areas on the Installation.
 - The owner is responsible for cleaning up after their pet.
4. No person shall keep a noisy, vicious, or dangerous dog or animal or one which is disturbing to other persons in any area on the Installation.
5. An owner of any animal causing injury or accident to an individual, property or equipment will be subject to personal liability and citation. Any dog that is found unattended may be seized and impounded by the San Luis Obispo County Animal Shelter, or any peace officer, at the owner's expense.
6. In addition to the above, no animals are allowed in Billeting quarters, or any living quarters on the Installation.
7. Exception to this policy are as follows:
 - a. This policy does not apply to trained "seeing eye", "signal", or "service dogs" used to guide a physically impaired person where present, provided, that such dogs shall remain under the immediate control of such persons. This section also applies to those dogs that are being

used by law enforcement agencies or other agencies to become “seeing eye”, “signal”, or “service” dogs.

b. Individuals utilizing the RV Park may keep their personal pets with them. These pets must remain on a leash at all times and are not allowed to run free. The owner is responsible for cleaning up after their pets.

c. Individuals assigned to resident housing units (i.e. building 630 occupancy in support of full time personnel), may apply for an exception to this policy. All exceptions, if approved, will require an animal deposit. This amount will ensure any/all damage to quarters and surrounding property caused directly or indirectly by pets can be repaired. The deposit will be refunded, less damages upon vacating the premises.

8. Your assistance in complying with this policy will insure environmental compliance and effective stewardship of the garrison, ranges and training areas.
